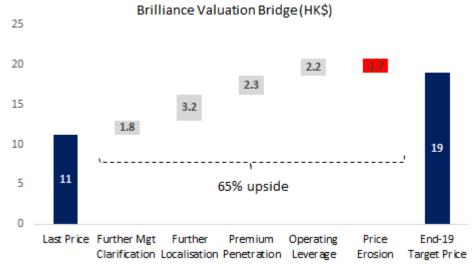
MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS

August was a more constructive month with the portfolio delivering +0.3% net vs. -2.3% MSCI EAFE ex Japan Local index. Underlying was a large divergence of performance across regions with Asia ex Japan (-0.9%) faring better than Europe (-2.6%) ... to realise when digging deeper that China had another month of awful performance (-3.9%), driven by further signs of deceleration and escalating Trade War rhetoric. In that light, we were encouraged to see the portfolio exhibiting resilience given most of our risk resides in China and Europe. Where to from here? Continued volatility through numerous events into year-end: Potential stimulus from China, (de)escalation of the Trade War, ongoing Brexit negotiations, Italian budget, potential contagion in Emerging Markets beyond current suspects, US mid-term election and finally the end of QE in Europe. We continue to feel comfortable with our low net positioning (20-25%), letting the stocks do the heavy lifting.

Key contributors/detractors. The key driver of the performance was a pleasing Q2/H1 earnings season. Of the 24 stocks in the portfolio, 18 outperformed expectations, 2 were neutral whilst 4 missed. On the positive front, our Short book provided significant relief (250bps) from falling markets. Our large China Auto short was down -14% due to decelerating volumes & earnings and a deteriorating balance sheet. Our EU Apparel and Aus Leisure shorts also missed, stocks being down -11% & -14% respectively. On the long side, Woodside continued to grind higher +5% inc. dividends post positive results. Brilliance also announced strong results and confirmed the ongoing JV discussions with BMW would only be concluded on shareholder friendly terms, stock up +21%. Sadly, that was it for the Long book with long-term holding Tui down -13% on disappointing Q3 results. The miss was driven by warm weather in EU leading to staycations rather than the usual pilgrimage to the Mediterranean. Robam and Zhou Hei Ya, although small positions, were both casualties of a slowing China consumer, stocks down 20-25%. Of the two, our investment thesis in Zhou Hei Ya was invalidated and we exited the position, as per our process.

On the trading front, we increased our Long position in Brilliance, Amer Sports and Woodside post strong earnings and lower share prices. We also added to shorts where our investment case was confirmed post results (Aus copper, Aus asset manager, Macau hedge). Finally, we exited our short in Janus Henderson and long in Bank of Ireland as both hit our price targets over the month.

As mentioned, Brilliance hit us hard last month (down 28%) due to worries around its JV with BMW. We got "some" confirmation that anything that will happen to the JV will be done in a shareholder friendly manner (i.e. at competitive price & with return of capital to shareholders). We took advantage of the share price weakness to continue to build the position given our conviction. Our bull case is best described by the valuation bridge below:

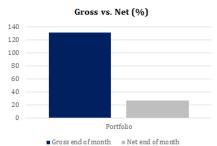

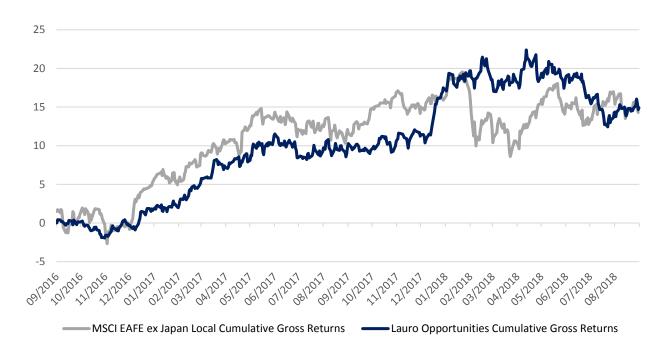
